At the end of March (26-28 March), ICCAIA was proud to conclude its successful first in-person Annual General Meeting and Conference 2025. With over 140 participants from the ICCAIA community, ICAO (Council, Air Navigation Commission, Senior Management and Secretariat), and industry partners, the conference showcased ICCAIA's strong commitment to the vital work of ICAO and its growing influence in shaping the future of the aviation industry.

It's clear that the manufacturing and services industry is facing both new challenges and opportunities. The discussions during this conference highlighted several **key priorities for the upcoming ICAO Assembly**:



- Advancing and enhancing aviation safety through innovation and emerging technologies.
- The long-term commitment to achieving Net Zero carbon emissions by 2050, with sustainable fuels and compatibility with 100% SAF by 2030 playing pivotal roles.
- Highlighting our collective industry investment of over \$15 billion annually in new technologies and the importance of maintaining sustained industry investment in research, development, and future-ready technologies.
- Addressing challenges posed by regional conflicts, supply chain issues, and workforce shortages.
- The need to strengthen and grow a skilled workforce to meet future growth.
- Addressing the rapid emergence of Advanced Air Mobility (AAM) and the need for robust safety and regulatory frameworks to support its integration.
- GNSS radio frequency interference (RFI), highlighting the urgent need for a global incident reporting system, improved civil-military coordination, and ICAO-led guidance on spectrum protection and multi-layered mitigation strategies.




ICCAIA'S FIRST CONFERENCE, A SUCCESS!

ICAO COUNCIL & ICCAIA BOARD MEETING

A Fruitful Discussion

The ICCAIA Board had the privilege of receiving an invitation from the President of ICAO to join an informal meeting of the full ICAO Council just ahead of our 2025 Annual General Meeting (AGM) and Conference. We were honored to be the first International Organization invited for such a session, and a valuable exchange followed.

Initially, the ICAO President and the Secretary General welcomed Board Members, highlighting the valuable contribution that ICCAIA makes to the ICAO work programme. ICCAIA Chair, Jan Pie, thanked the President and the Council for the opportunity to have a dialogue on the main concerns of the industry ahead of ICAO's 42nd Assembly. Jan highlighted the industry's environmental commitments and reiterated its commitment to ensure 100% SAF compatibility of new aeroplane and engine products by 2030, noting that industry collectively invests around 15 billion dollars annually in new technology developments.

He also explained that the industry still faces many supply-chain and workforce challenges, partly a hangover from the pandemic but also vulnerabilities as a consequence of regional conflicts. However, on the upside, we expect that over 45,000 new aircraft will enter the fleet, and Jan highlighted the need for ICAO to be ready. There followed a fruitful discussion focused on these points with the ICAO Council Member States gathered around the table.



INFORMAL BRIEFING TO THE ICAO COUNCIL ON GNSS RFI

On 21 March, ICCAIA joined IATA, IFALPA, IFATCA and CANSO in delivering an informal briefing to the ICAO Council on the growing challenges posed by Global Navigation Satellite System (GNSS) Radio Frequency Interference (RFI) and the urgent actions required to address the threat at the international level. IATA described the operational challenges faced by airlines and highlighted the scope and rapidly increasing frequency of the issue. IFATCA highlighted the risks of difficulty in maintaining certainty of the aircraft's location and IFALPA shared firsthand experience from the flight deck when a system is compromised by spoofing. In addition, CANSO emphasized the importance of maintaining a minimum operational network of conventional navigation aids to ensure system reliability during GNSS disruptions – a position strongly supported in IFALPA and ICCAIA's own presentations.

Ben Linder from Boeing and Hughes De-Beco from Airbus spoke on behalf of ICCAIA, outlining short-, medium-, and long-term solutions to mitigate GNSS interference, ranging from improved technical information for operators to the development of reliable recovery. The discussion with the ICAO Council was lively and engaged, with an emphasis on actions. ICCAIA looks forward to further discussions and engagement, including at ICAO's upcoming 42nd Assembly.

ICAO GLOBAL IMPLEMENTATION SUPPORT SYMPOSIUM (GISS) 2025



ICCAIA participated in ICAO's *Global Implementation Support Symposium (GISS 2025)* hosted by the UAE General Civil Aviation Authority (GCAA) in Abu Dhabi, from 10 to 12 February. Many of ICCAIA's members were present and contributed to panel sessions of the event, which focused on environmental sustainability and capacity building.

Additionally, represented by Nina Brooks, Executive VP of ICCAIA and Chair of GAAST, the Global Aviation and Aerospace Skills Taskforce (GAAST) made a declaration of commitment to work with ICAO's Next Generation of Aviation Professionals (NGAP) programme to address future workforce challenges during the event.

Nina Brooks also participated as a speaker on a panel 'Evolving Training for Sustainable Aviation', along with other influential women leaders in the industry, including Fiona Hau (Vice Chair of GAAST). This panel discussed strategies for attracting, training, and retaining aviation talent to support sustainability, focusing on innovation, lifelong learning, and workforce development. It also addressed challenges like workforce shortages, regulatory constraints, and integrating sustainability practices for long-term growth.

ICAO GISS 2025 provided a valuable opportunity for ICCAIA and GAAST to gain visibility and raise awareness of ongoing efforts to make the aviation and aerospace sector one of the most attractive industries to work in.

CAEP/13 MEETING

Driving Global Environmental Standards Forward

In February, after two intensive weeks of discussions and exchanges, the 13th meeting of the International Civil Aviation Organization Committee on Aviation Environmental Protection (CAEP/13) concluded with the participation of over 200 participants from Member and Observer States and international organizations, including ICCAIA.

Important agreements have been reached, such as the establishment of a methodology for monitoring and reporting on progress in CO2 emissions reductions towards the ICAO Long Term Global Aspirational Goal (LTAG) of net zero carbon emissions by 2050, more stringent noise and CO2 standards for subsonic aircraft and a new noise certification standard for supersonic aeroplanes.



The outcomes of this meeting are being reviewed by the ICAO Council and are expected to play a key role in informing global policy decisions at ICAO's Assembly in September 2025.



Additionally, Juan Carlos Salazar, ICAO's Secretary General, and Justin Erbacci, ACI's Director General, joined the group on the last day to express their support for the taskforce and its initiatives.



This meeting showcased the significant progress achieved through the collective efforts of all members and provided an opportunity to advance discussions on building a sustainable aviation workforce. PREPARING FOR THE 42ND ICAO ASSEMBLY: ICCAIA's Strategic Contributions



The ICAO Assembly, convened every three years, brings together 193 Member States and a wide range of international organizations to shape global civil aviation policy for the upcoming triennium. It also serves as the platform for electing the ICAO Council. The 42nd ICAO Assembly will be held in Montreal from 23 September to 3 October 2025, preceded by the Innovation Fair (21–22 September) and the ICCAIA Board Meeting on the afternoon of 22 September.

As part of the preparation process, all Working Papers (WPs) are expected to be posted by 13 September 2025 on the Assembly's official webpage, although ICCAIA will be working well in advance with its Small Group to review all papers as they appear.

ICCAIA requests that delegations planning to attend the Assembly notify the ICCAIA Secretariat by 31 July 2025. ICAO needs to receive credentials through ICCAIA's official letter accordingly. Please note that **online registration** will also be required once the delegation is officially confirmed. ICCAIA's Strategic Approach to Assembly Preparation

ICCAIA's preparation efforts are being led by the Assembly Small Group, in collaboration with relevant committees, to ensure alignment with ICAO's priorities and reflect the collective input of ICCAIA members. A final review will be carried out by the Strategy Committee, ensuring a coherent and well-informed industry voice at the Assembly.

The Assembly represents ICCAIA's most significant engagement with ICAO, offering a vital platform to share industry insights with global regulators and policymakers.

This year, ICCAIA is actively working with members on a wide range of **important topics**, including:

- ⇒ Innovation and advanced mobility
- ⇒ Environmental sustainability
- ⇒ Cybersecurity
- ⇒ Halon replacement
- ⇒ Workforce
- ⇒ Safety and airworthiness
- ⇒ Accessibility

Subject matter experts from various panels and working groups have been engaged to ensure that ICCAIA's positions align with ongoing ICAO work and that the most pressing issues are prioritized.

PREPARING FOR THE 42ND ICAO ASSEMBLY: ICCAIA's Strategic Contributions

Collaboration Across the Aviation Community

ICCAIA continues to coordinate with other major international aviation organizations—such as IATA, CANSO, ACI, ATAG, IFALPA, IBAC, and the Flight Safety Foundation—to incorporate diverse perspectives and strengthen advocacy on issues of shared concern.

Flexibility remains a cornerstone of ICCAIA's strategy, allowing for agile responses as new developments emerge. Several working papers have been drafted and are currently under review, while others are being revised, repurposed as briefings, or further developed based on member feedback.



Looking Ahead

ICCAIA continues to advocate for its papers to ensure they gain the necessary support and visibility during the Assembly. As ICAO begins releasing working papers from Member States and other international organizations, ICCAIA will assess their positions to prepare potential responses or interventions as needed.

We extend our sincere appreciation to all contributors, authors, and reviewers for their dedication and hard work. The 42nd Assembly will be a pivotal moment to reaffirm our shared commitment to a safe, innovative, and sustainable future for global aviation.

MALAYSIA AEROSPACE INDUSTRY INITIATIVES FOR SME FINANCING

Malaysia Aerospace Industry Association (MAIA)

The Malaysia Aerospace Industry Association (MAIA) has been working closely with key stakeholders - including the Ministry of Investment Trade and Industry, and the National Aerospace Industry Corporation Malaysia as well as Malaysia's central bank Bank Negara Malaysia (BNM) - to create supportive SME financing for aerospace small and medium sized enterprises in Malaysia.

In the post Covid-19 pandemic era, many new opportunities have opened up for Malaysian aerospace SMEs. However, these companies often face challenges in securing finance for investment, despite having the necessary technical capabilities to undertake new programs. To address this, MAIA has facilitated multiple engagements between financial institutions, government agencies, and SMEs to help these businesses access the required financial support.

The Malaysian Aerospace Industry Blueprint 2030 has set ambitious targets for growth, and with several Tier-1 companies poised for expansion, it is critical for Malaysian aerospace SMEs to meet this increasing global demand. If Malaysian SMEs are not able to scale up, there is a risk that multi-national companies will source their supply needs from other countries. MAIA and the Malaysian government's financing initiatives are aimed at supporting SMEs in this critical period, ensuring they can meet the growing demands of the industry and contribute to achieving the goals outlined in the Aerospace Blueprint.

Key measures include the introduction of a new incentive framework focused on high-value activities, job creation, and ESG investments. A MYR200 million Strategic Co-Investment Fund will support SMEs and mid-tier companies, while the New Industrial Master Plan Development Fund encourages technology adoption, with a target of 3,000 smart factories by 2030. The government further plans to support local startup enterprises as well as expand the venture capital ecosystem. Business assistance measures include BNM's MYR3.8 billion SME loan fund for digitalization, Malaysian Industrial Development Finance Berhad grants for aerospace and E&E sectors and matching grants for local aerospace SMEs.

In support, MAIA aims to keep its members, including SMEs, updated on relevant industry developments as well as maintaining a comprehensive database to offer detailed guidance on the various grants, incentives and loans available.
